School Attendance and Tardiness

At Notre Dame ACE Academies we strive to make "every minute count". We want to have a full and meaningful learning day. It is important that your learner is on time each day. The gates open at 7:30 for homeroom and 7:50 is morning gathering. Students are recognized for living our core values during the morning gathering. Car Line

Keeping students safe during 'drop off' in the mornings and 'pick up' in the afternoons is our primary concern. Our suggested best practice is to remain in the car line, while dropping off and picking up your child(ren). Parking your car and walking to get your son/daughter disrupts the flow of traffic and increases the

possibility of an accident as parents and students navigate between parked and moving cars.

Additionally, we ask that if you are in the car line, please remain in your car--do not leave your car unattended and parked in the car line. If you need to stop in the office or school, please park your car by the church and walk down.
